### Lulworth Castle: Early May Bank Holiday 2010

*Living history, drill displays and a skirmish on Sunday and Monday 2nd and 3rd May. Gentry etc inside the castle. Please let us know in advance if you want to be gentry.*

*The campsite will be open from Friday 12 noon until Tuesday 10am. If you want to authentic camp on LH site, please let the Muster Organiser know in advance so that we can keep a space for you and send you special entrance instructions. There will be a wedding at the castle on Saturday afternoon, so we have been asked to keep a low profile whilst guests are arriving.*

*Saturday is a free day except for putting up the living history. Please lend a hand with this if you can; we do need some help as it's a big job. Then go and enjoy yourselves. See next page re. events in Poole.*

*The Weld family, who own the estate, still live there. It is a lovely place with country walks and village trails. A visit to the abandoned village of Tyneham is well worth the effort. On the downside, the mist rolls in and it can get cold at night so bring your woolly bedsocks.*

*Breakfasts at the cafe on Sunday and Monday from 8am.*

*Lunches Sunday and Monday on the Living History – please buy tokens in advance at the Guard Tent so that we can calculate numbers.*

*Beer tent on the plastic site, courtesy of Max, stocked this year by the Piddle Valley Brewery.*

*Ale house on the living history. Beer in exchange for TOKENS only - get them at the Guard Tent.*

*Pub in the village does meals and usually has a band Sunday evening - details later.*

*Get your groceries and ciggies on the way. Lulworth is in the back of beyond.*

*Please: sign in everyone, including children and non-participants;*

*don't drive or set up camp beyond the barriers*

*note fire precautions;*

*read the welcome sheet and the notices;*

*ask at the Guard Tent or the Information Tent if you need anything.*

**ACCESS:** We have been asked to clarify some points as residents have been disturbed by participants to some events.

DO NOT go in the main entrance to the castle when you arrive. Follow signs for the campsite. These should take you past the castle entrance, round to the left; follow the estate wall; enter a track at the back of the site.

There will be no pedestrian access to the campsite via the road after dusk. If you want to walk in, [e.g. from the pub!] please do so via the castle, taking the paths up and over the hill.

Nearest station: Wool - direct line from Waterloo.

By road: From Bournemouth: take the A35 towards Dorchester and turn left onto the A351 towards Wareham. From the bypass, turn onto the A352 signposted to Wool. Follow the brown signs for Lulworth Castle.

From Dorchester: from the bypass, take the A352 signposted to Wool and Wareham. At Wool follow the brown signs to Lulworth Castle.

ECWS signs will appear somewhere along this route.

Saturday – visits to Poole: [ask Roger Emmerson for more details]

The coaches will pick up and drop at the public car park which is at the front of the site. You can leave your car there if you wish. To get back to the plastic camp on foot, please walk over the hill. To get back by car, drive out of the exit and round the road to the back entrance.

There will be no pedestrian access to the campsite via the road after dusk. Residents have had problems during events in the past and will call the police if there is any disturbance.

### **GETTING FROM THE PLASTIC CAMP TO THE LH**

If driving, go out of the site and round via the public road. Please check the Welcome Notice for which entrance to use for setting up the LH on Saturday.

No-one is to drive over the hill from the plastic camp to the castle unless they have permission from the estate manager. Anyone who does may be asked to leave.

Disabled access to the Living History [or just old and creaky, or heavily laden!]. There is a disabled car park near the cafe. If necessary you can be driven right up to the living history site. Please ask at the Guard Tent for details and a pass. We will help you. No vehicle movement on the castle/LH site 10.00- 18.00 when the public are there.

And finally, the sponsor has had problems at other events with people sneaking in from the back of the site to avoid payment. You can go up to the top site in civvies whilst the event is open to the public but if you do please have your membership card handy. Site staff may ask to see it if they spot you not wearing a wristband to show you have paid. If you don't have a card you will be escorted off the site. Temporary members can show a temporary membership card, with the name of their regiment on it. Any problems, please see us at the guard tent. We have temporary membership forms there.
